CISCO PARTICIPATES IN TOUR OF NEW LOCAL 130 TRAINING CENTER

CISCO's Executive Director Dan Allen and Director of Communications & Public Affairs Gary Karafiat attended a guided tour of the new Plumbers' Local 130 U.A. Joint Apprenticeship Committee's (JAC) Training Center (Chicago campus) on April 17th.

The tour was arranged by The PCA Midwest & Plumbing Council, and was led by U.A. Local 130 JAC Training Director James Majerowicz.

During the tour, Majerowicz took the group of 14 attendees from the roof to the ground floor. The green roof features solar panels to create hot water for the entire building. Six different wetlabs feature 94 faucets, and commercial and residential plumbing fixtures and a water heater lab for the apprentices to learn their craft. Currently, 230 apprentices are being trained there.

In addition, he highlighted the grey water harvesting used for the irrigation system for the trees and plants in the outdoor plaza. And Majerowicz also showed the rainwater harvesting system that takes rainwater off the roof and stores it in both a 10,000 gallon underground tank and a 3,500 above ground tank and puts it back into the plumbing system to flush urinals.

Majerowicz added that since the training center opened in June last year, 220,000 gallons of water has been saved because of this system.

A positive outcome of Lobby Day involved Senate Bill 3052, which

amended the Contractor Prompt Payment Act by reducing retention on private and commercial construction projects down to 5% when a project is 50% complete.

Despite long-time opposition from the Illinois Bankers Association and Illinois Association of Realtors, the IMSCA-sponsored legislation passed out of the Senate and advanced to the House, bringing it one step closer to helping ease our industry contractors' cash flow burdens.

FIVE STUDENTS CHOSEN FOR CISCO SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

The winners of CISCO's 2018 Scholarship Program will be formally recognized and honored during CISCO's Annual Luncheon on May 4th.

The entries received were in two categories – 1) four-year scholarships (\$2,000/year) to high school seniors, and 2) two-year awards (\$1,000/ year) for seniors planning to attend community college.



Eligible students were the sons and daughters of either building

trade union members or union contractor employees. An independent review of the 64 scholarship applications was conducted and the names of the winners were certified and contacted. A total of 5 winners were chosen – three for the 4-year scholarships and two for the 2-year awards.
