CEMENT MASONS LOCAL 502 BREAKS GROUND ON NEW TRAINING CENTER

A new Training Center will be built this summer in Bellwood for apprentices of both the Cement Masons Local 502 and the Plasterers Local 5. The 20,000 square-foot building is expected to be open sometime in October 2017.

"We are very excited about moving into this new facility," said Pat LaCassa, President/Business Manager of Local 502. "We need to continue to attract young men and women into these trades and having state of the art classrooms and dedicated areas for instruction of the craft is vital."

"We also want to thank members who have been very supportive of this project," said Larry Picardi, Local 502 Secretary-Treasurer. "We have never had our own training center, and we are happy to be staying in the area."

The structure is being built next door to the Cement Masons Union Hall in Bellwood, and Picardi said it will provide a campus feel to its members and apprentices who have been using facilities in Alsip for the past two years.

The new Apprenticeship Training Center will also contain 10,000 sf of space dedicated to the instruction of pouring, finishing and removing concrete, as well as areas where work on floors, curbs, stairs and other aspects of the trade will occur.

On the Plasterers side, additional space will be constructed where apprentices will be instructed on the latest techniques; with an emphasis on critical life-safety applications, and current fire-proofing methods.

Currently, 93 cement masons and 18 plasterers are enrolled in the apprenticeship program. The Cement Masons employ one coordinator and two instructors, while the Plasterers employ one coordinator and one instructor.

Acting Director of the Illinois Department of Labor Anna Hui is leaving her position to accept the head of Missouri's labor department.

Hui had just been appointed acting Director in February to replace Hugo Chaviano after he stepped down in January. No news yet on any future appointments to leadership positions at IDOL.

Under Governor Rauner, the Illinois Department of Labor has been largely ineffective and has not posted last year's prevailing wage rates, and a lawsuit has been filed against the department.
