# WATER REC. DISTRICT APPROVES MULTI-PLA FOR COOK COUNTY



The
Metropolitan
Water Reclamation
District of Greater
Chicago (MWRD)
approved a 5-year
Multi-Project
Labor Agreement

during the district's Thursday, August 3rd meeting.

The MWRD Board's adoption of the new MPLA is on behalf of itself and each of its contractors and subcontractors and the Chicago & Cook County Building & Construction Trades Council.

The new MPLA eliminates the "Site-Specific" loophole that would have allowed contractors, who **do not** pay fair wages and use inadequate training standards, to bid on future projects.

"The new MPLA was a matter of serious discussion here on the Board of Commissioners, and CISCO's guidance on this issue was valuable to us," said MWRD Commissioner Debra Shore. "I was happy to cast a vote that ensures a level playing field for contractors who have made a permanent commitment to treat their workers fairly," she added.

"The collaborative voices and letters from contractors and trade unions helped make this happen. The passage of this MPLA means that the District will continue to use only the most skilled union labor force to build critical, complex infrastructure projects, that will in turn, provide stronger worker safety conditions, and just as importantly, protect the health and water safety of the District's residents," said CISCO Executive Director Dan Allen.

# GROWING COALITION BRINGS INDUSTRY LEADERS TOGETHER

Building Our Communities, a oneyear old coalition of labor industry leaders and elected officials, held a meeting in Chicago last week to discuss important issues facing the middle class, and to formalize its organizational structure and take the group into a more active role.

Keynote Speaker Professor Bob Bruno, University of Illinois, presented on "Issues Affecting the Middle Class", and Karyn Charvat, Executive Director of Power Forward DuPage spoke on "Marketing the Middle Class".

Professor Bruno stated that the United States is no longer a middle class nation as less than 50% of households fit within that spectrum, and he cited a dozen examples of why the middle class continues to shrink.

Bruno mentioned decreasing productivity, reductions in jobs that don't require a college degree, domestic job outsourcing, income inequality, and the fall in hourly compensation as some of the reasons.

When asked about solutions, he said investment in education, increases in infrastructure spending, raising the minimum wage, increases

in research and development spending, and eliminating "right-towork" (for less) laws were priorities.
