III-FFC NOTES RECENT SUCCESS WITH HELPING PASS RBOs

Editor's Note: The following are excerpts of a recent publication from the Indiana, Illinois & Iowa Foundation for Fair Contracting (III-FFC) re: the passage of Responsible Bidder Ordinances (RBOs).

How RBOs Help Responsible Contractors

III-FFC helps responsible contractors win bids by passing RBOs where possible and has passed almost 60 RBOs across Illinois and Indiana.

CISCO, PowerForward DuPage and the DuPage Building Trades helped with the recent passage of an RBO for DuPage County - one of the reasons that CISCO recognized DuPage County as its 2021 Public Body of the Year recipient.

What is an RBO?

• RBOs help ensure a local government body hires only responsible contractors who will provide the highest quality of work safely, on time, and on budget.

• RBOs establish clear, objective criteria that contractors must meet in order to be eligible to bid on public works projects in a community.

• RBOs increase local contractors employing local workers, resulting in more dollars circulating through the local economy and businesses.

Why does the III-FFC help pass RBOs?

• Almost all RBOs put safety and training at the forefront. RBOs require proof of participation in a USDOL approved apprenticeship program. This guarantees only qualified and safe contractors, subcontractors, and workers are used on public construction projects.

• RBOs increase work for responsible contractors who pay family-supporting wages and benefits.

• Public bodies, taxpayers, and skilled craftspeople all benefit from RBOs.

DEPARTMENT OF LABOR TO HIRE 100 INVESTIGATORS

The U.S. Department of Labor (USDOL) recently announced an initiative to add 100 investigators to its Wage and Hour Division (WHD)—a potential sign to employers that increased enforcement may be on the horizon.

The WHD is tasked with enforcing comprehensive labor laws that affect more than 148 million workers.

This latest push for WHD investigators tracks with the White House's larger agenda of strengthening workers' rights.
