The event also featured the "passing of the gavel" (see photo at left)and remarks by immediate past President Matt

Erickson of CJ Erickson Plumbing Co., and a heartfelt acceptance speech by Kennedy as his 2-year term commenced.

Brian Kennedy was initiated as a plumbing apprentice with UA Local 507 in 1981. After spending the prior year working in the shop of Gehrett Plumbing in Chicago owned by his father, Frank. After completing his apprenticeship, Brian worked as a union plumber until taking over as company President in 2012. Brian has served on the PCA and Plumbing Council boards for over a decade. He is a Local 130 Pension Fund Trustee and was previously a JAC Trustee.

WORKERS' RIGHTS AMENDMENT TOP BALLOT INITIATIVE IN 2022

In November 2022, Illinois voters will have the chance to vote on a Constitutional Amendment that would prevent Illinois from ever passing a state law or local ordinance that interferes with, negates, or diminishes the right of employees to organize and bargain collectively over their wages, hours, and other terms and conditions of employment and workplace safety.

If approved by voters, the Workers' Rights Amendment would permanently ban so-called "right-towork" laws in Illinois.

"Right-to-work" laws allow workers to free ride and take all the benefits of collective bargaining—such as higher wages, benefits, and legal representation—for free, without paying.

A 2021 study by the Illinois Economic Policy Institute (ILEPI) and Project for Middle Class Renewal (PMCR) at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign shows that workers are better off in Illinois than they are in states with "right-to-work" laws.

The average worker in Illinois earns about \$57,000 per year in income from wages and salaries, significantly more than in "right-towork" states. After accounting for the higher cost-of-living in Illinois and

other factors, Illinois workers earn 6% more. They are 5% more likely to have health insurance. Fewer Illinois workers are below the poverty line, and Illinois workers are 3% more likely to own their homes, despite facing some of the highest property taxes in the nation.
