Students who graduated this month and are on track for further education in the union construction industry or a union apprenticeship are:


Rudi Robinson - Crane High School.

CISCO PARTNERS WITH PEOPLES GAS AT NEW TRAINING CENTER

Peoples Energy unveiled its new \$20 million training facility in Little Village, located at 4228 W. 35th Place.

Peoples Gas, along with their construction contractors, will support the city, Chicago Public Schools and CISCO to develop and implement two successive high school internship experiences. These experiences will develop young people through mentorship, and career readiness training, to create a direct pipeline to trade apprenticeship opportunities.

The new training center will feature a mock "gas city" with a fully functioning natural gas delivery system to 20 mock homes and businesses. There, employees and their contractors will practice installing and servicing natural gas pipes and meters, conducting safety inspections, locating pipelines and responding to emergencies.

Barring the passage of a FY2018 budget - or an appropriations bill that would pay for transportation-related projects - the agencies will have no authority to expend funds after the current fiscal year ends on June 30. At press time, a budget has not been passed.
