INDUSTRY NEWS RE: WAGE THEFT

Through the leadership of the Secretary of Labor, Marty Walsh, and the Biden Administration, proposed updates to the Davis-Bacon Act regulations have been introduced. The last time changes were made to the regulations, Ronald Reagan was President.

Every year, thousands of workers are victim of wage theft. In 2017 alone, nearly 8,000 workers were cheated out of their wages, and the Department of Labor recovered almost \$30 million in back wages through enforcement actions. The proposed updates will strengthen Davis-Bacon prevailing wage enforcement.

Public comments are being submitted in support of updating the Davis-Bacon Act regulations.
